We continued with our new business model providing a balance of programs and services both virtually and in person while we also offered grocery pickup and delivery, frozen meal delivery and transportation to vaccination sites.

In 2021 OSCC55+ staff continued to support and achieve many of the goals in the City of Oshawa Age-friendly Strategy.

Our accomplishments were highlighted by being recognized as Not for Profit Business of the Year by the Greater Oshawa Chamber of Commerce.

We continue to build our business through the establishment of new corporate and community partnerships to better serve seniors and placed more students from post -secondary educational institutions in our branches through placement opportunities.

The OSCC55+ provides a critical role within the City of Oshawa Teaching City projects partnering with Ontario Tech, Durham College and Trent University focusing on isolation of seniors during COVID and the effects on mental and emotional health.

What began as challenges in 2020 became opportunities in 2021 for collaboration, partnerships and alliances in serving seniors' needs.

We focused on achieving success not in spite of the pandemic but because of it. New technology, Mercuri, Zoom and Skype, enhanced our social media presence.

Our branches reopened successfully with the health and safety of those most vulnerable top of mind.

Online Programs



Continuing Education

Providing an opportunity for members to participate in a variety of classes from their homes continued to be a focus of the Continuing Education staff. As members became more comfortable with technology, the registrations increased.

An Ontario Trillium Foundation Grant provided an 'online streaming studio cart' for each branch, which enabled staff to provide 'hybrid' classes simultaneously in branch and online to benefit more members in the fall session.

Hybrid Courses are the first of their kind in Ontario.

Senior Summer Kick Off

On June 1st the Seniors Summer Kick Off announced the arrival of 'June is Seniors Month'. With 20 free sessions throughout the day on a virtual platform (Zoom), including fitness, dance and yoga classes, guest speakers, health information and more.

635 online attendances – including The Honorable Raymond Cho, Minister for Seniors and Accessibility

Recreation and Special Events

Social programs assisted members with staying engaged and connected from the comfort of their homes through discussion groups, brain games, guest speakers, information sharing, and more.

Online special events often included a delivery of activities and food brought right to members homes; for an extra special touch to add to the enjoyment.

Due to COVID-19 restrictions many seniors continued to isolate at home, creating an ongoing need for OSCC55+ to maintain home delivery of food boxes, frozen meals, hot meals and groceries.

To meet this need, OSCC55+ partnered with two Oshawa businesses, Pelican catering to deliver frozen and hot meals and Liz's No Frills to pick up groceries.

OSCC55+ also partnered with Community Care Durham (CCD) in the first quarter of 2021, to assist their staff and volunteers to deliver fresh produce and community food boxes to clients in Durham Region. (CCD received an Ontario Community Support Grant (OCSP) which funded these activities).

Our support in the community grew in 2021 and forged relationships that will continue to bind together agencies, corporations and businesses whose values connect with service to seniors.


We set the example of how to look outside of our own goals to connect strategic actions with others to collectively achieve success.
